Our Key K Words



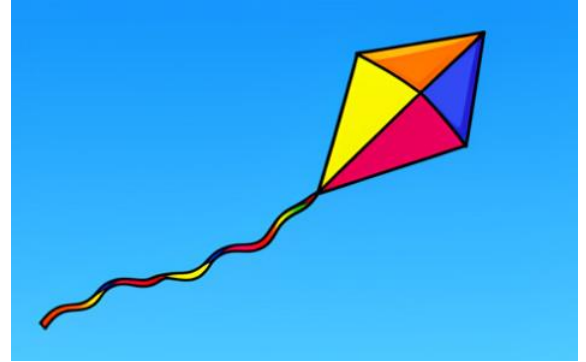
King

A man who rules a country and wears a crown.



Key

A small metal tool used to open a lock or a door.



Kite

A toy made of paper or cloth that flies in wind.

Making the K Sound

Let's practice!

To make the sound for **K**, we use the back of our tongue. It sounds like a little click in your throat: /k/ /k/ /k/.

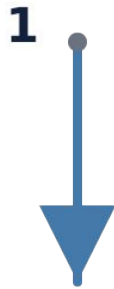
It sounds just like the letter **C** in 'Cat'. Can you try it? Put your hand on your throat and feel the quick 'pop' of air!



How to Write Letter K

Step 1

Draw a straight line down from the top.



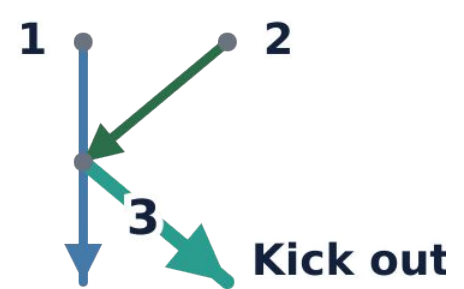
Step 2

Start from the side and kick in to the middle.



Step 3

Kick out to the bottom corner.

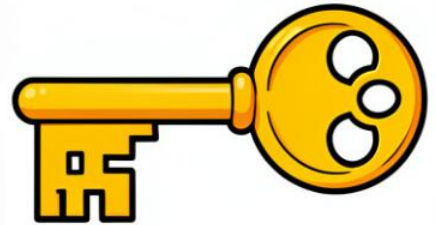

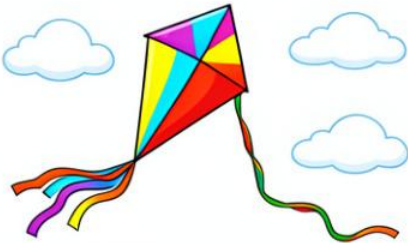

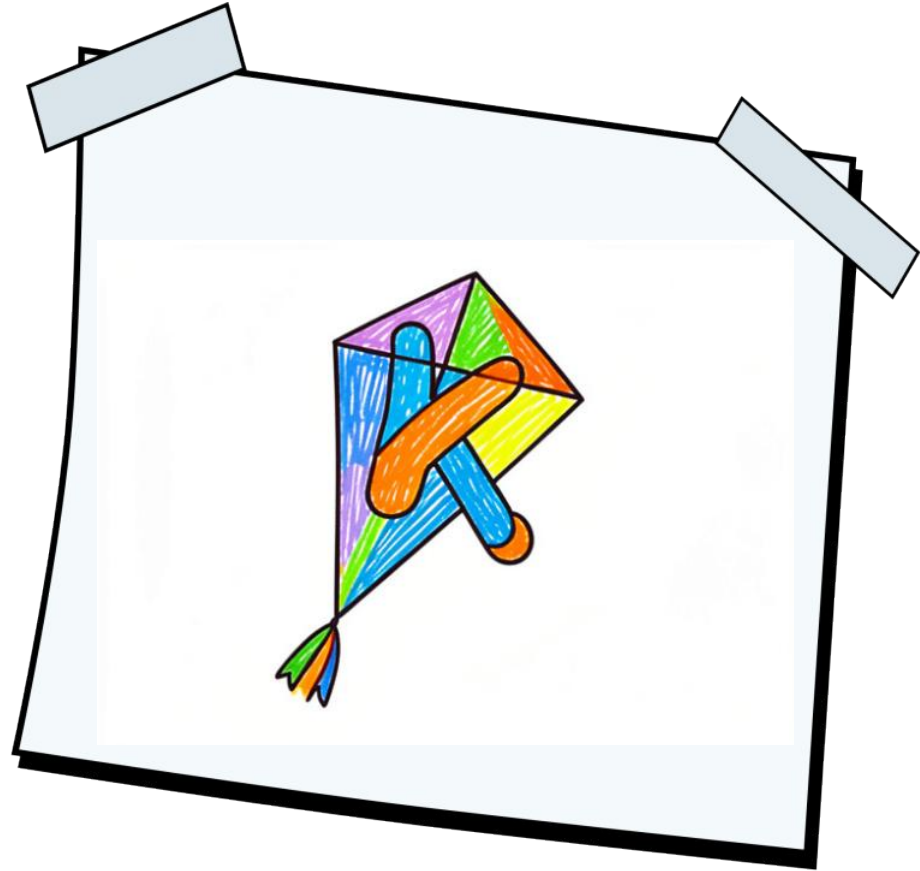
